- Please do not exit at the staff car park entrance.

- There is supervision by teachers from 8.30 each morning to ensure all precautions are in place for students entering the school.
- Sanitiser dispensers at all entrance doors to the school. All pupils must sanitise their hands on entrance to school.
- Hand sanitisers in all classrooms also.

- Staggered leaving times for all class groups at home time.
- There is warm water, soap dispensers and sinks in the classrooms and also outside Reception which is used upon entrance to the school.
